Senior Corner: SPICE UP YOUR LIFE: Everyone knows that herbs & spices enhance the flavor of almost any dish; but did you know that they are also loaded with powerful plant compounds known as *phytochemicals* that help to fight a myriad of diseases? <u>Parsley:</u> Provides Vitamins A & C, potassium, calcium, & has a high concentration of flavonoids (powerful antioxidants that provide cardiovascular & cancer protection). Add chopped parsley to your pastas & salads. (dried: 1-3 yrs; fresh: 7-10 days in fridge; freezer:4-6 months)



<u>Cinnamon</u>: Improves cholesterol metabolism & boosts insulin sensitivity; especially beneficial for people with type 2 diabetes, pre-diabetes, weight issues & metabolic syndrome. Sprinkle it on cereal, toast, cooked apples, yogurt, coffee, hot cocoa, etc. (ground: 1-2 years)



Garlic: Its immune boosting properties make this the perfect spice for cold & flu season. Use it freshly chopped or minced & add it to your foods at the end of cooking. (fresh, whole: 3-6 months; clove, 1-2 months))



<u>Ginger</u>: One of the best all around spices for disease prevention because of its anti-inflammatory properties. It's also valuable for boosting immunity & for reducing nausea. Grate or chop fresh ginger root into salad dressings, sauces & seafood or poultry dishes. Dried, powdered ginger is even more potent than fresh & can be used in cooking or sprinkled directly onto foods. (fresh, freezer: 3 months; ground: 2-3 years.)

Oregano: Loaded with antioxidant power. It's loaded with 40 times more antioxidents than apples. It's perfect for adding a Mediterranean twist to food. You can add it to your salad dressing, mix with extra virgin olive oil & rub it on chicken breasts before grilling or mix it with smashed avocado & lemon for a tasty substitute for mayonnaise on sandwiches. (dried: 1-3 years)

Get into the simple, tasty & super-healthy habit of adding herbs & spices liberally & regularly to your life.

HOW OLD ARE YOUR SPICES? Nothing lasts forever & that includes your herbs & spices. As a general rule whole spices will stay fresh for about 4 years, ground spices for about 3 years, and dried leafy herbs for about 1 year. If you're not sure how long you have some spices, err on the side of caution and get fresh ones. (This from the Internet)


