Beginning this fire season PG&E will be implementing a **Public Safety Power Shutoff** Program throughout California. The Office of Emergency Services has said to expect at least 3 possible power shut offs, maybe more, each fire season. The power will remain off until PG&E has inspected all the power lines, this inspection process could take 3 to 4 days. I am in the process of trying to secure funding for a standby generator. This will allow us to keep the senior center open during power outages. A standby generator will allow the senior center to provide the following services: Community Haven

Designated cooling/hydration center

Charging station for motorized scooters, cell phones/ laptops

Free Wi-Fi and computer access

Serve lunch on site and deliver Meals on Wheels



Egg Salad with Chopped Gherkins From Allrecipes.com

Recipe By: Sunsetinaz

Prep Time: 25 mins Cook time: 10 mins Serves: 4

This Classic egg salad works well in sandwiches, on crackers, in a lettuce cup, or in a tomato half.

Ingredients:

8 eggs 1/2 cup mayonnaise 1/4 cup chopped green onion 1/2 Tbsp chopped celery, or more to taste 1 Tbsp chopped gherkins, or more to taste 1 large tomato Lettuce Cucumber, sliced for garnish

Directions:

1. Place eggs in large saucepan and cover with cold water. Bring to a boil and remove from heat. Cover the saucepan with a lid and let sit until eggs are cooked through, 10 to 12 minutes. Drain and rinse with cold water until eggs are cold. Peel and chop eggs.

2. Stir chopped eggs, mayonnaise, green onion, celery, gherkins, brown mustard, and dry mustard together in a bowl. Season with salt and black pepper. Sprinkle paprika over the top.

3. Place a bed of lettuce on plate. Cut top out of tomato and remove insides. Fill with egg salad. Serve with cucumber slices and crackers.

Fruit Cocktail Punch - By Divas Can Cook

Prep: 15 mins Serves: 24

Ingredients:

46 oz pineapple juice, chilled

- 64 oz apple juice, chilled
- 64 oz white grape juice, chilled 2 liters lemon lime soda, chilled
- 1 1/2 cups powdered sugar
- 2 cups green apples, sliced or chopped
- 2 cups peaches, sliced
- 2 cups watermelon, chopped into small cubes
- 2 cups pineapple, chopped into small chunks

Directions:

- 1. In a large drink dispenser, or punch bowl, add pineapple juice, apple juice, white grape juice and soda.
- 2. Stir in powdered sugar until sugar dissolves. (taste and add more sugar if needed)
- 3. Add in the chopped fruits.
- 4. Chill overnight or at least 3 hours, to give the time to flavor the punch
- 5. Serve cold.






